ANTI-SHARK FINNING POLICY

Shark finning is the cruel practice of removing any shark fin (including the tail) before discharging the rest of the shark into the sea.

Atun Sostenible, Ltd. S.A. as a company responsible for sustainability and care for the marine ecosystem, it expressly prohibits shark finning from being practiced on board the company group of vessels.

This practice generates considerable uncertainty regarding the total biomass and species composition of the sharks caught. Any retained shark must be landed with fins naturally attached.

International Standards, the FAO Code of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries, as well as its Action Plan for the Management and Conservation of the Shark Population, Measures taken by the IATTC and other regional organizations, Panamanian regulations such as Law 9 of 2006, prohibit such practices.
